CHIEF TISHOMINGO



GO deep and engage in our historically rich county, where 17 sites are listed on the National Register of Historic Places adding varied and rewarding explorations. Tishomingo County is named for the renowned war chief of the Chickasaw Nation, and a mural dedicated to and depicting Chief Tishomingo's life can be viewed by car on Main Street in Tishomingo. In Iuka, take a walking tour of this deeply rooted city yields an abundance of historic treasures, among them the Iuka Covered Bridge, the Pioneer Log Cabin, the Church of our Savior, and the Old Courthouse Museum.

For a more challenging hike through history, visit the highest point in Mississippi, Woodall Mountain, located near the grounds of the Civil War Battle of Iuka, where complex battle plans were blown away, literally, by an "acoustic shadow" caused by the wind which prevented Union reinforcements from hearing any of the ferocious battle occurring only a few miles away. You can take a driving tour of the battlefield site (also listed on the National Register) and the Oak Grove Cemetery where the fallen soldiers of that battle are buried.

CHURCH OF OUR SAVIOR

Experience the timeless charm of the Church of Our Savior, a beautifully restored 1873 board and batten Carpenter Gothic Episcopal Church. Rescued and rejuvenated by dedicated local citizens in 1985, this historic gem stands as a testament to community pride and preservation.



OAK GROVE CEMETERY

This sacred ground serves as the final resting place for both Civil War soldiers and the venerable John Marshall Stone, Mississippi's longest-serving governor.



IUKA PIONEER LOG CABIN

Located in Mineral Springs Park | Iuka, MS 38852

Step back in time at the Iuka Pioneer Log Cabin, a living testament to history. Constructed in 1879, this log and native stone dogtrot cabin stands as a rustic masterpiece, offering a glimpse into the pioneer spirit of the era.

Mineral Springs Park, named after Chickasaw Chief Iuka, is famous for its award-winning mineral water from the 1902 World's Fair. The park features a playground, pavilion, historic dogtrot log cabin, picnic area, walking track, skateboard facility, and tennis courts. Coming soon to Mineral Springs Park - pickleball courts and a splashpad.

IUKA COVERED BRIDGE

On Indian Springs Road and Gaines Street adjacent to Mineral Springs Park

Cross the enchanting Iuka Covered Bridge, a unique gem as the only covered bridge in the state open to vehicular traffic. This historic structure invites you to take a nostalgic journey, where each creaking board and weathered beam whispers tales of a bygone era.

BATTLE OF IUKA | SEPTEMBER 1862

The Battle of Iuka was a pivotal Civil War episode in the Confederate campaign into Kentucky. Under General Braxton Bragg's orders, Major General Sterling Price moved into Iuka to prevent Union General William S. Rosecrans from reinforcing Nashville. Union General Ulysses S. Grant planned to trap Price by having Major General E. O. C. Ord advance from the west while Rosecrans attacked from the southwest. Delays hindered Rosecrans, and Ord waited for the sounds of battle, which an "acoustic shadow" obscured.

Caught off guard, Price faced relentless assaults, resulting in fierce fighting and heavy casualties, including Confederate General Henry Little. Although Union forces won, they failed to capture Price, who escaped to join General Earl Van Dorn. The Union claimed Iuka, but Price's escape allowed further conflict, leading to the Confederate assault on Corinth in October 1862. The Battle of Iuka remains a significant chapter in Civil War history.

GO wild and wonderful with family and friends. In fact, the adventures are endless at Tishomingo State Park. Try rock climbing or take the adventurous walk across the Park's swinging bridge spanning Bear Creek, where kayakers are paddling the 6.5-mile route. There's also swimming, hiking, camping, and more to explore. Running through the Park is the Natchez Trace Parkway, where history dates back to before the earliest indigenous peoples; today the timeless beauty remains, and so do essential Native American sites including Cave Springs and Bear Mound & Village.

For outdoor lovers with a special love for the water, there's no more refreshing destination than J. P. Coleman State Park. Nestled on a rocky bluff overlooking the Tennessee River, the Park lets visitors dive in for skiing, fishing, tubing, wakeboarding, boating, and more. And with 50,000 acres of inviting water recreation spread across Tishomingo County—two lakes, a waterway, and seven marinas—boating is legendary everywhere. Also legendary: Hunting on the thousands of acres in and adjacent to the County.

Other must-experience highlights include Woodall Mountain, the highest peak in Mississippi; the sparkling cascade of Cooper Falls; and the aptly named Goat Island on Pickwick Lake. The island is the ideal spot to view migratory birds and feed the friendly wild goat herd from the shoreline or your boat.

WOODALL MOUNTAIN

Follow signs from Highway 25 south of Iuka to County Road 187 to County Road 176 to County Road 185, the scenic gravel drive to the top of Woodall Mountain.

Ascend to the summit of Woodall Mountain, standing proudly as Mississippi's highest elevation at 806 feet.



COOPER FALLS

Experience the natural wonders of Pickwick Lake and Bay Springs Lake, celebrated for their breathtaking scenic beauty, including the iconic 50-foot Cooper Falls situated on Pickwick Lake just north of J.P. Coleman State Park. This mesmerizing waterfall is a hidden gem, accessible only by boat.

CAVE SPRING

Embark on a journey through history with the Natchez Trace Parkway, an All-American Road and National Scenic Trail meticulously preserved by the National Park Service. Stretching 444 miles from Natchez to Nashville, this scenic and historic parkway unveils a tapestry of points of interest and breathtaking vistas.

Popular stops along the Natchez Trace in the area include:

BEAR CREEK INDIAN MOUND | milepost 308.8

--small ceremonial mound built between 1200 and 1400 AD

CAVE SPRING | milepost 308.4

--cave, interpretive sign, and paved walkway

TISHOMINGO STATE PARK | milepost 304

--full-service state park and Mississippi's premier nature preserve

TENNESSEE-TOMBIGBEE OVERLOOK | milepost 293.2

--an overlook, picnic area, interpretive signs, and paved walkway

PHARR MOUNDS | milepost 286.7 (Located in adjacent Prentiss County)

--a 90-acre complex of eight burial mounds built 1,800 to 2,000 years ago.

This is the most important archaeological site in North Mississippi.
